Ambassadors for Higher Education

MCC regularly communicates with legislators, foundations, state nonprofit organizations, communities and the media about the public good of higher education and community service and service-learning work of college students. MCC finds that many stakeholders are unaware of the crucial impact higher education makes for communities now and in the future through the civic education of students. These stakeholders turn into enthusiastic supporters of higher education once informed of the civic engagement work done by Michigan campuses. MCC coordinates efforts and holds meetings to provide value and visibility to member campuses and their presidents.

Partners for a 'Serving' Michigan

MCC is part of a dynamic state-wide partnership called the ConnectMichigan Alliance. This Alliance of state nonprofit associations works closely together to provide a comprehensive approach to promoting volunteerism in Michigan now and into the future. ConnectMichigan is creating a model for other states in collaborative work, cost savings and greater impact.

A Voice for Student Leaders

MCC has the oldest among Campus Compacts and one of the most well respected student leadership programs in the country. Working with students we help them to find a voice in the state for civic engagement and service to others. MCC programs help students to develop leadership and learn from one another while adding a greater meaning to their educational experiences.

Opportunity to Make a Difference

MCC works with member campuses to help them be as dynamic and engaged with educating students, supporting their communities, and fulfilling their civic missions. Forums for discussion, gatherings, and committees help to make a difference in the civic education of students.

Cross-sector collaboration

MCC membership is the only state organization that brings public and private, religious and secular, and two-year and four-year institutions together to collaborate. This intentional gathering of all the higher education sectors creates synergy for the sharing of ideas and common goals for student learning.

Financial Support of Engagement Efforts

MCC has leveraged over 1.6 million dollars to support civic engagement on member campuses, with 1.3 million dollars in grants directly to campuses over the past 13 years. Grants have provided campuses funds for community project, travel to an event, training and professional development, campus-wide and individual service-learning projects and provided crucial support to community engaged learning.
